

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicant must be a senior attending high school or other secondary school.
2. Applicant must be a child or grandchild, including stepchild or legally adopted child, of an active APWU member, a Retirees Department member, or a deceased member of the union. The APWU active or retired member must have been in good standing for at least one year immediately preceding the application deadline or preceding death.
3. Scholarship recipient must attend an accredited college or university, community college, or an accredited vocational school or vocational program for a consecutive period.
4. Scholarship must be used to pursue an undergraduate degree or a post-secondary occupational education.



Relatives of APWU elected National Officers are not eligible.

HISTORY

E.C. Hallbeck Memorial Scholarship

When the five predecessor unions merged to form the APWU in 1971, the new union decided to maintain an academic scholarship program created in 1969 by the United Federation of Postal Clerks (UFPC) as a tribute to UFPC president E.C. "Roy" Hallbeck. Today the APWU Hallbeck Memorial Scholarship program is a self-perpetuating financial base for providing significant educational assistance to children of APWU union members. In the past, \$1000 was awarded to one recipient from each of the five postal regions. Beginning in 2010, APWU will award \$1500 for four consecutive years of college to at least two recipients from each of the five postal regions.

Vocational Scholarship

The APWU National Executive Board established the Vocational Scholarship to help students interested in programs of study leading to trade, technical, industrial or vocational occupations that can include: *Culinary, Medical or Dental Assistant, Electrician, Real Estate, Auto Mechanic, Certified I/T-Computer Education, Massage Therapy or Cosmetology.* At least two recipients from each of the five postal regions will receive \$1,000 for up to three consecutive years of school.

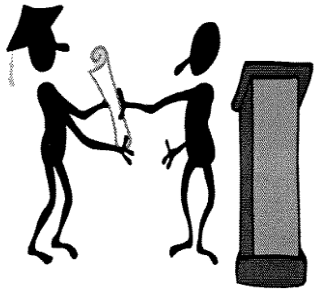

HOW TO APPLY FOR APWU SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship applications must be made on an official application form or a photocopy of the form. Applications must be obtained from the APWU Website, www.apwu.org

Application judging is conducted by an independent panel of academics.



Winners will be judged on the basis of their personal leadership and academic achievements, essays and SAT, ACT or PEAU scores (if applicable).

The Hallbeck and Vocational Programs will award two winners from each of the five postal regions annually:

- (1) Central
- (2) Eastern
- (3) Northeast
- (4) Southern
- (5) Western

All forms and materials must be submitted in **ONE ENVELOPE** via **United States Postal Service.**



The responsibility for submitting a COMPLETED APPLICATION and required materials to the scholarship program by the date listed BELOW rests with the student applicant.
