Obama Proposed \$10 Billion to Help Homeowners Refinance Mortgages. "Obama pledged \$10 billion to increase pre-foreclosure counseling and help 'responsible homeowners' refinance their mortgages or sell their homes." (*Boston Globe*, 1/14/08)

Obama Voted Against Privatizing Federal Jobs. Obama voted to block the Bush Administration's scheme to outsource and privatize hundreds of thousand of federal jobs. (S.Amdt. 4895 to H.R. 5631, Vote 234, 9/6/06)

Obama Supported an Economic Stimulus Package for America's Workers. Obama voted to end a Republican filibuster of an amendment to the economic stimulus bill extending unemployment insurance benefits for all unemployed workers, and an additional 26 weeks for workers in high-unemployment states. (S.Amdt. 3983 to H.R. 5140, Vote 8, 2/6/08)

Obama Would Cut Workers' Taxes. Obama has pledged to restore fairness to the tax code by providing "Make Work Pay" tax cuts of up to \$1,000 per working family. (www.obama.com)
