Re: USPS Made Improper Changes to New Employee Orientation Process

Director, Support Services Division for APWU-Represented, Career and Non-Career, Employees

APWU National Dispute: HQTC20220354

Please be advised that pursuant to Article 15, Sections 2 and 4, of the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA), the APWU is initiating a Step 4

Dispute.

The issues and facts involved in this dispute are as follows:

The USPS has unilaterally changed the new employee orientation process. Among the issues that violate the CBA are:

- Providing false and/or misleading declarations to new employees that the APWU at the national level has agreed to this new process and "signed off" on this procedure.
- Limiting the Union's time for its presentation to new employees, in violation of Article 17.6 and the JCIM, Article 17.6. This is also a past practice violation in numerous offices/Locals.
- By limiting the APWU's amount of time to address new employees, this harms the employees who will not receive necessary information from the Union in terms of contractual rights, health benefits, etc.

• Conducting these new employee orientations solely at District offices, preventing many APWU Locals from having the opportunity to address the employees who each Local will ultimately represent.
