We note that since the deal with Staples was announced, the USPS has reduced the hours of service in more than two dozen San Francisco-area Post Offices, all of which are near a Staples store with a postal counter. It is apparent that more cuts in postal services are planned, along with the eventual closing of U.S. Post Offices.

As you know, Staples itself is experiencing a decline in sales and has plans to close at least 225 stores by the end of 2015. We are concerned that in pursuing its arrangement with Staples, the USPS will leave many customers without access to any nearby Post Office.

Only the U.S. Postal Service can accomplish the mission it has carried out with distinction for more than two centuries: Providing universal mail service to all Americans, in every corner of the country.
