This letter is in follow-up to your October 23 correspondence regarding the appropriate medical officer's signature on Postal employees' Department of Transportation's (DOT) health card for Commercial Drivers' Licenses (CDL).

Please be advised that the Postal Service follows the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) regulations regarding medical examiners. FMCSA's regulations require that medical examiners must be certified and listed in its database. A medical examiner can be a doctor of medicine (MD), doctor of osteopathy (DO), physician assistant (PA), advanced practice nurse (APN), and doctor of chiropractic (DC).
