APWU Contract Negotiations and Chapter Tailgating Kickoff!

With contract negotiations set to begin on Feb. 19, retiree chapters can support the fight for good jobs and good service by hosting an APWU Tailgating Party. The Retirees Department encourages retiree chapters to get active in the run-up to bargaining and throughout the negotiating period.

Tailgating Parties can be held during regular meetings or special chapter meetings. Let us know when you plan to host your event, so that we can send you stickers and other material.

Before the Event:

- Invite your retiree members, local president, officers, and Contract Action Team members to the tailgate. Let them know that the retirees are there for them during the negotiation.
- Invite retiree non-members and ask them to join the union.
- Invite retiree leaders from other unions and members of community organizations who will support our efforts. Offer door prizes and plan a budget (or ask for donations) to serve refreshments to help ensure a good turnout.
